HOMECOMING GATHERING ALLOWS BROTHERS TO RECONNECT AND REMINISCE ABOUT INDIANA ALPHA

The following are highlights of alumni's memories of their days at Indiana Alpha.

Ed McDonald '65 from Seattle, Wash., has traveled back to West Lafayette every year since 2005, when SPE celebrated its 100th anniversary. Ed recalls having a white, two-seater Triumph TR3 back at Indiana Alpha. "My brothers called me 'Breezy Ed,' because I drove this little sports car with the top down." Only juniors and seniors were to have cars on campus but, as a sophomore, Ed escaped the rules by showing up at the infirmary exhibiting asthma symptoms. Brothers had fun pulling pranks on Ed and his TR3. They once buried his car under piles of leaves, which took Ed hours to uncover. Another time, they moved the TR3 into the Great Hall without Ed having a clue. Ed recalls when he and Lawrence "Lorrie" Volland '63 took over the Go Cart program. "We were in charge and became co-drivers. We won the Grand Prix that year!" A picture of the victory can be found in the trophy case on the main floor of the house.

David Schoeff '64 remembers operating concessions, including approximately five cigarette machines placed in sorority houses. "Every week, I'd collect money from these machines and go to Lafayette and restock the machines. This was the only legitimate license to get on the second floor of the sorority house." There was also the university sing **Jim Long '63** organized. David remembers being part of the Glee Club, which is still active today.

Byron White '64 has returned to Purdue every year since the fraternity celebrated its 100th anniversary. He recalls driving the milk truck around campus for short trips. He also chuckles over a headline that appeared in *The Exponent* after Ed McDonald and Lorrie Volland won the Grand Prix that same year. The caption under the picture

indicated that Lorrie was prom queen, NOT the driver of the go cart. After that, the brothers fondly referred to Lorrie as "Queenie."

Roger Blocks '62 traveled from Racine, Wis., to attend this year's Homecoming. He recalls painting SigEp's Greek letters on the side of the milk truck and heavily padding the inside so that it was like a "rolling bed." He also recalls the chapter having four Iron Key students at the time, out of the nine on campus. The house had a resident dog, Sam, a Belgian shepherd.

There was also the time when brothers conducted a mock political convention, where they ran A.B. "Happy" Chandler for president. Chandler was the 44th and 49th governor of Kentucky.

Tim Downing '90 states "All of us look the same. There hasn't been much change." He and **Steve Pushka '91** recall sharing the house with around 90 brothers, adding that the relationships they formed resulted in a long-lasting bond. "They're good, high-caliber people," says Steve, who traveled from Park City, Utah, for Homecoming. Steve says that every one of his brothers has been successful in both their careers and family life.

Jared Kennard '04 remembers sharing the fraternity house with 80 brothers and never having a dull moment. He recalls visiting each fraternity house during recruitment week. However, Sigma Phi Epsilon had a respect factor that impressed him.

Living in the area as county commissioner for the Tippecanoe County Board of Commissioners, **John Knochel '65** stopped by to reminisce. John credits the relationships formed at Sigma Phi Epsilon for developing skills necessary to relate to the many types of people he's encountered in his political career over the last 20 years.
